Registration & Enrollment: To secure your child's spot for September 2026, families must complete the registration process and submit all required documents.

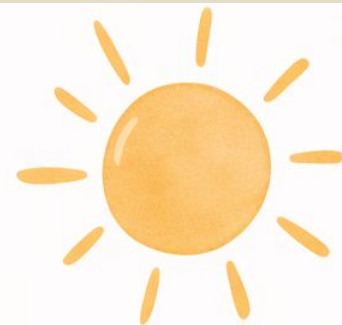

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to Village Elementary preschool community! We are excited to partner with your family and look forward to a wonderful school year ahead.

As part of the enrollment process, we are required by the State of New Jersey to ensure that all students meet the state mandated immunization requirements for preschool attendance. These requirements are established by the New Jersey Department of Health to help protect the health and safety of all children and staff.

All students must submit a current and official immunization record from a healthcare provider showing that they are up to date with New Jersey required vaccines for their age and a Physical by their doctor. Immunizations must be documented prior to your child's first day of attendance. The following are required by the State of NJ:

- DTaP - 4 doses
- IPV (Polio) - 3 doses
- MMR - 1st dose after 12 months of age, 2nd dose in Kindergarten
- PCV (Pneumococcal) - 1 dose required
- Varicella - 1 dose at 12 months
- HIB - 1 dose required at 12 months

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Please ensure that your child receives the Flu/Influenza vaccination. One dose is required between September 1 and November 30 of the current school year (not required after the age of 5). Once the vaccination is completed, please email documentation to me.

New Jersey School Vaccine Requirements for Child Care & Preschool



New Jersey requires children attending child care centers and preschools to meet **minimum immunization requirements**. These vaccines help protect children from serious illnesses that can easily spread in group settings, where young children are in close contact with one another. For the best protection, children should follow the [AAP childhood schedule](#).

The information below shows the number of vaccine doses required based on a child's age at entry. Fewer doses may be needed than what is listed if the child is behind schedule. Talk to your child's health care provider for details.

The notes on the second page will provide additional information and resources.

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New Jersey School Vaccine Requirements for Child Care & Preschool



This is a summary document. New Jersey's minimum immunization requirements are based on the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), [AAP childhood schedule](#).

Before entering child care/preschool: All children will need to show proof of receiving at least one dose of each required vaccine; this is called provisional admission. A child entering school in a time frame not listed would be required to receive the vaccines in the previous age group. For example, a two-month-old would need to receive the same number of doses as a three-month-old to attend a child care and preschool facility.

Upon attendance: All children will need to receive vaccines by the time frames listed on page one. The AAP immunization schedule provides age ranges for certain vaccines. For example:

- DTaP is recommended at 15 through 18 months.
- IPV (polio) is recommended at 6 through 18 months.
- MMR and Varicella are recommended at 12 through 15 months.

Because these recommendations are given as ranges, children may receive vaccines at any point within that window. Some children receive doses earlier in the recommended range, depending on their well-child visit schedule. New Jersey child care and preschool requirements are structured to allow families the full recommended time frame to complete doses. For example, a child may receive three doses of IPV as early as six months of age. However, because the recommended window for the third IPV dose is 6-18 months, New Jersey would not require documentation of that third dose until after the full window has passed (by 19 months), allowing families the entire recommended period to meet the requirement.

Children who are not up to date with the required vaccines will be required to follow the catch-up immunization schedule; parents should speak to their health care provider to help their children get caught up. Fewer doses may be needed than what is listed if the child is behind schedule.

Medical and religious exemptions (reasons for not receiving vaccines) are detailed in the Immunization of Children in Child Care Centers and Schools regulations. Instructions for viewing the regulations are available at nj.gov/health/cd/imm_requirements/acode. Another resource is the "NJ Immunization Requirements Frequently Asked Questions," available at nj.gov/health/cd/imm_requirements.

IPV/OPV: OPV is not recommended for use, nor is it available in the United States. However, OPV may be utilized in other countries. Doses are only accepted if given before April 2016. Children who receive OPV doses after April 2016 must receive IPV doses instead. The third dose of IPV/OPV can be given as early as six months, but is required by 19 months.

Hib: By six months, children need at least two doses of Hib, but some children may have three doses by six months, depending on the vaccine brand they received.

Hib/PCV: Vaccine doses may be acceptable with fewer than listed, depending on when the vaccines were given and the vaccine type. Refer to the recommended/catch-up schedule. In all instances, one or more doses must be administered on or after the first birthday.

Flu: One dose of flu vaccine is due every year by November 30 for all children six months of age and older enrolled in child care or preschool.

MMR: Children can receive this vaccine as early as 12 months, but it is required for child care/preschool attendance by 16 months.

Varicella (Chickenpox): Children can receive this vaccine as early as 12 months, but it is required for child care/preschool attendance by 16 months.

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SAMPLE SCHEDULE FOR TOOLS OF THE MIND

FULL DAY (6 HOUR) PRE-KINDERGARTEN



Creating a schedule can be one of the trickiest aspects of your job!

Below is a sample of a daily schedule. Keep in mind - this is only one suggestion – you may need to adjust the arrangement of the time blocks to fit the needs of your particular school schedule and students.

KEY REQUIREMENTS of a Tools Schedule:

- Time in each large group activity should be 15 minutes or less
- Make Believe Play Block is at least 60 minutes, uninterrupted. It is strongly suggested that this occur in the morning

Times marked 'Program Specific' indicate that these times may vary from school to school. You will need to think about your particular constraints/requirements when determining how much time is spent on program specific activities.

We expect children to demonstrate positive and caring attitudes, show respect for their peers and staff, and listen attentively to the staff at all times. Community Programs are unable to accommodate children who exhibit behaviors that are deemed unacceptable. Unacceptable behavior includes, but is not limited to:

When a student's behavior becomes such that the safety or well-being of others in the school is endangered, it will be necessary to exclude the student from school for an appropriate period of time. Building administration has the ability to exercise discretion relative to the Code of Conduct in order to support and maintain a safe and orderly school environment.

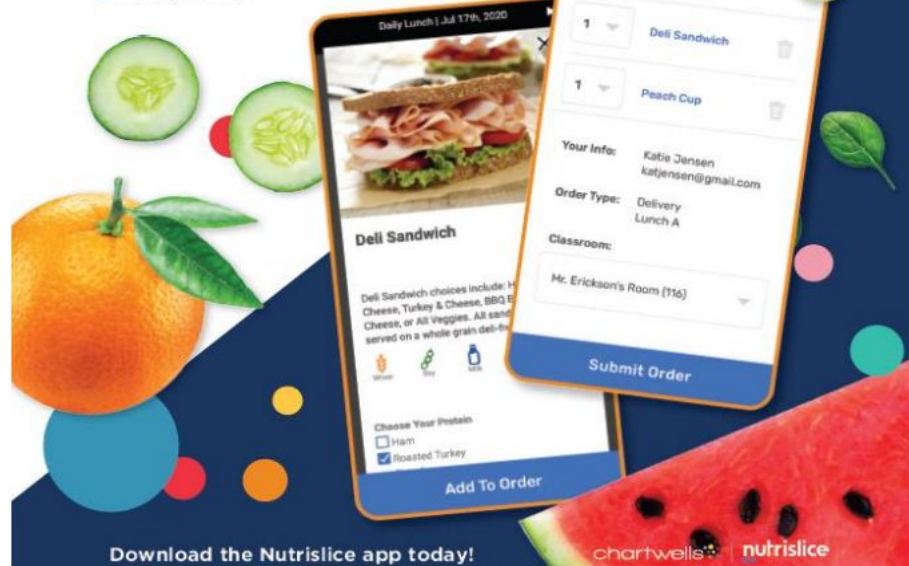

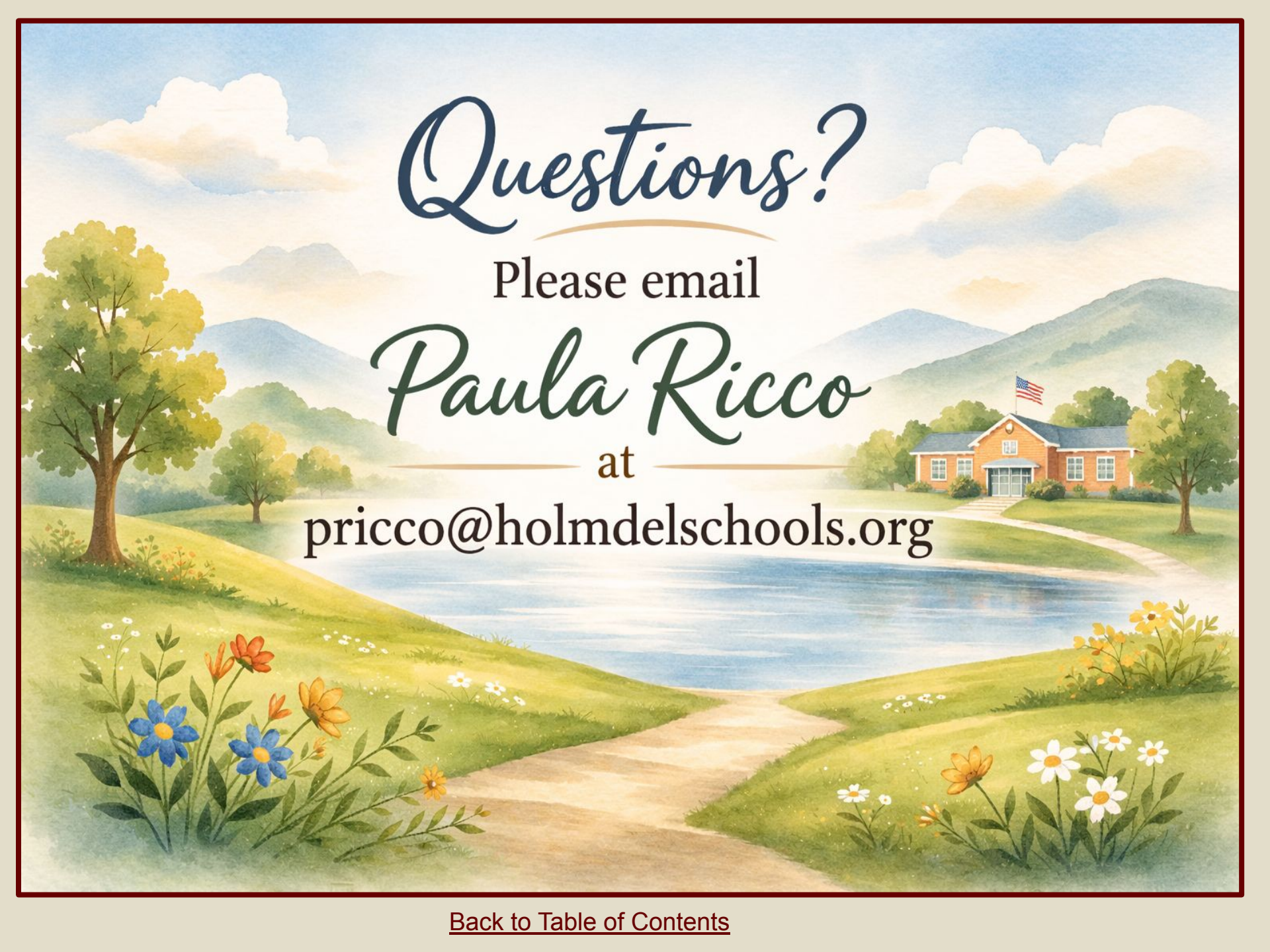
